Black Cabbage is another locally grown product that is as fantastic as always.

The locally grown Rainbow Chard is amazing this year.

Now the cold has kicked in the Root Veg is at it's best - lovely and sweet. Swedes, parsnips, turnips, carrot, beetroot.
The large British Savoys have started in earnest. Leafy and green and large.
The Foraged Three Cornered Leeks have started and are coming through regularly. English Wet Walnuts are still around. English Rhubarb will be starting any day.


Monk's Beard, or Agretti, has started very early.
